Work ranges from yard clean-up to painting, from building access ramps to installing new siding. Homeowner selection is based on income, need and willingness to partner with ABWK. Volunteer labor and donated materials, when available, are used to keep costs low.

From the pastor...

Dear Friends,

I witnessed my first Living Nativity at First United Methodist - along with nearly 700 other witnesses! What an incredible gift it was to so many and me as we sought to focus our attention on the newborn Savior.

What helped focus our attention - was Pete on the top of the tall ladder in the back running the spotlight! When I spoke to Pete after the performances, he of course, down-played his role. However, among all the key and critical roles in that holy cast, including Mary, Joseph, the Magi, the Shepherds, Gabriel the Holy Angel and the multitude of angels, and the baby Himself - was the spot light! Yes, you read correctly. The Spot Light.

As the crowds huddled together in the darkness of the mild evening, the spot light shone from side to side, highlighting the different scenes as they emerged, in sync with Tom Ervasti's powerful narration of the sacred story. What struck me the most, however, was when it was completely dark and one powerful and single light shone from above onto Joseph, Mary, and the Baby. One powerful and single light shone in the darkness. That was the scene that stood out for me as a first-time witness to this Live Nativity.

In the Church we are called week after week, as we gather for worship, prayer, and praise, to proclaim that powerful light to the world. We have just celebrated it at Christmas and throughout Advent. Now, with January 6, the Day of Epiphany, we enter into an entire season of light.

While so many other gods claim to be the light of life, there is really only one light that makes a difference in our lives. Even as the heavens were opened at Jesus' baptism, so the heavens have opened for us. Only recently have we celebrated the Son come down from heaven - for us. In a few months we will celebrate the Spirit, coming from the heavens in wind and fire (light).

In our own baptisms, the heavens figuratively opened as God has welcomed us as his children and promised to be the light of our life, the lamp unto our path.

While the light is returning to our half of the world, The Light from heaven has never left. While Pete needed a spot light to simulate the light shining from the heavens, and did so effectively, Jesus needs no spotlight, for He is The Light Himself, and effectively with it, draws our attention to Him.





Wednesday Adult Bible Study in January



Join us on Wednesday evenings, beginning on January 9, at 6:00 p.m. in the church lounge for a new six-week study of John Ortberg's book, The Life You've Always Wanted: Spiritual Disciplines for Ordinary People. The study will be co-led by Pastor Dale and First UMC member and pastor, Tom Ervasti.

Participants are encouraged to purchase the book, but is not necessary in order to participate. Some copies of the book will be available in the church office for purchase. Contact Pr. Dale or Carol Schmidt if interested in purchasing one.

A brief description of the book study:

You can live a deeper, more spiritual life right where you are.

The heart of Christianity is transformation—a relationship with God that impacts not just our "spiritual lives," but every aspect of living. John Ortberg calls readers back to the dynamic heartbeat of Christianity—God's power to bring change and growth—and reveals both the how and why of transformation.

The book offers modern perspectives on the ancient path of the spiritual disciplines. But this is more than just a book about things to do to be a good Christian. It's a road map toward true transformation that starts not with the individual but with the object of the journey—Jesus Christ.

As with a marathon runner, the secret to winning the race lies not in trying harder, but in training consistently—training with the spiritual disciplines. The disciplines are neither taskmasters nor an end in themselves. Rather they are exercises that build strength and endurance for the road of growth. The fruit of the Spirit—joy, peace, kindness, etc.—are the signposts along the way.

Paved with humor and sparkling anecdotes, the book is an encouraging and challenging approach to a Christian life that's worth living—a life on the edge that fills an ordinary world with new meaning, hope, change, and joy.

HELP Health Equipment Lending Program

Do you or someone you know need temporary medical equipment?

HELP began in 2010 with the idea of three men from the community (two from Trinity Lutheran Church and one from First UMC) who saw the need for health equipment to be available to all who may have need of it.

HELP offers used medical equipment to anyone with a temporary need. The equipment can be "borrowed" for up to six months, but can be extended with a phone call for another six months – for a total borrow time of one year. The equipment is housed at First UMC.

The equipment is donated by individuals and health care providers. It is cleaned and sanitized before being issued for use.
