40% will be given to Simpson Housing

Simpson Housing Services began as an emergency overnight shelter in the basement of Simpson United Methodist Church in 1982. Simpson has since become a leading nonprofit providing assistance to people experiencing homelessness.

40% will be given to Emma Norton

Emma Norton Services partners with women, children and families who are homeless and experiencing the challenges of mental and/or chemical disabilities. Without having to worry about the basic need of a safe, secure place to live, women and children can utilize and focus on supportive programs, life skills, services and opportunities available to accomplish their goals.

10% will be given to Joyce Food Shelf

"The mission of the Joyce Uptown Food Shelf is to distribute food to those in need, with respect and dignity, as an expression of the love of God." The Food Shelf gives clients a three-day supply of nutritionally balanced food once a month. It will also make referrals to other agencies for additional services.

10% will be given to VIM Scholarships

The United Methodist Volunteers in Mission movement arose through the local church, as United Methodist felt called to express their faith through hands-on mission. The UMVIM motto, "Christian Love in Action," is taken from 1 John 3:18, in which Christians are asked the love "not in word or speech, but in truth and action."

February will be the Love Offering for the MN Annual Conference.

Publicity & Social Media: Matt Silver of the Chisago County Press did an awesome job with the Living Nativity writeup and continues to be a big supporter.

Barb Prindle's Facebook posts are continuing to generate good responses. Suggestion made to use Facebook for polls or suggestions; google docs was presented as an alternate suggestion.

Lay Leader: Memorial Day Service is hitting a big milestone - 25th year. Invites are going out to this year's service to dignitaries and past pastors and members.

Staff/Parish Relations Committee: Met on January 19th.

Finance: Year end checking account ended almost exactly where it did the previous year - only a \$65 difference over 12 months. Council voted on 2020 budget. Motion to approve by Wendy, second by Andy. Budget passed.

Continuing to meet with church members individually to discuss broader UMC matters and how they might affect our congregation. I continue to urge all our members to be patient as they seek to understand differing theological and Biblical views and/or perspectives within our congregation. Let's continue to embrace and celebrate the diversity among us and not let us divide. Following the UMC General Conference in Mpls in May and the MN Annual Conference gather in June we will update the congregation on the next steps and possible timeline as received by the Annual Conference.

Lent 2020 - A Journey of Stones



Our Lenten journey at First UMC Lindstrom this year will draw from the rich imagery and symbolism of rocks and stones found throughout Scripture. These powerful images of stones (and our tendency to throw them) are painfully representative of our sins.

As you worship with us throughout this season of Lent you will be invited to bring with you, each week, a rock or a stone (of any size or shape), representing the sin in your life, to be placed at the foot of our large wooden cross that will be displayed in our sanctuary.

On Easter Sunday morning, this collection of stones and rocks will "be moved", as the stones sealing Jesus' tomb "were moved", serving as a powerful and vivid illustration of how Jesus removes our stones of sin.

Our Wednesday evening adult Bible studies will be a time of further reflection and conversation about the stones (sin) in our lives as we consider each week's assigned scripture reading. As Easter Sunday arrives, we will give thanks that what we could not do ourselves (move our stones), someone else (Jesus) has done for us!

Palm Sunday, April 5 — The Final Stone — Matthew 27:60
Maundy Thursday, April 9 — Stones To Bread — Matthew 4:1-11
Easter Sunday, April 12 — The White Stone — John 20:1-18; Revelation 2:17





A Service and Learning Opportunity for All Ages



Intergenerational Mission Trip Rapid City, South Dakota





Where? Rapid City, South Dakota is settled into the Black Hills and in the shadow of Mount Rushmore. It also shares a border with the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation.

Why? Faced with nearly impossible economic circumstances, many of the Lakota have moved to Rapid City in search of work. And while some have found a glimmer of hope, they are still in dire need of shelter and other basic resources. In Rapid City, many local missionaries and Christian ministries have answered the call. They have helped to paint and repair homes, and perhaps more importantly, they have worked to build relationships with adults and children alike. This mission trip will provide the opportunity to support this effort that many have already begun as together, we strive to bring light and hope to these struggling communities.

What Will We Do? We will be spending three days learning about and serving alongside people who make the Rapid City and Lakota communities their home. Particularly we will have the opportunity to visit with and learn from local elderly residents of these communities, learn about the need for low-income housing improvements, and partner with other local ministries and non-profit organizations, yet to be determined. Some learning sites may include the Red Cloud Indian School, Wounded Knee, Lakota College, a Pow Wow, and a buffalo ranch to feed buffalo and learn and hear the story of the White Buffalo Calf Woman.

Other Local Attractions To Be Seen - Throughout our three days of service and learning we will end each evening with a group activity and closing worship and devotion. Activities will include visits to Mount Rushmore National Memorial, Crazy Horse Memorial, Custer State Park, and other local fun activities.

Transportation and Housing - Families will travel in their own vehicles. Two church vans will also be available for youth in grades 6 or older who plan to participate without their families. We will be staying at a church in Rapid City in designated spaces for families and separate genders. Air mattresses, cots, and/or sleeping pads will be needed. As needed, depending on physical needs of some participants, local hotels are also an option.
