#### A Brush with Kindness/Twin Cities Aid July Mission Focus

The July Mission of the Month is A Brush with Kindness.

This ministry works in collaboration with Habitat for Humanity as "a Christian beautification and preservation program for low-income and elderly homeowners."

A Brush with Kindness ensures people can live in a safe, well-maintained home by assisting low-income homeowners impacted by age, disability or family circumstances with necessary exterior maintenance and repairs.

A Brush with Kindness offers services such as painting, landscaping, weather stripping and minor repair services using volunteer labor and donated materials to keep costs low. They often work alongside homeowners who are able, helping them to reclaim their homes with pride and dignity.

You can help by: referring local homeowners who need assistance to the program by encouraging them to complete the Homeowner Application, volunteering time and/or materials needed for projects, providing a financial gift by indicating "A Brush With Kindness" or "Missions" and the amount you would like to donate with your giving to First UMC in July.

#### From the pastor...

Dear Friends,

"Who is the Church?" "We are the Church!"

You've likely heard that before. It's true, isn't it? The people of God make up the Church, not any building. You and I are the church we call First United Methodist in Lindstrom. We are a church with members of a multitude of ages, backgrounds, experiences, and convictions. We are one church coming from numerous communities and neighborhoods, with different gifts to offer, struggles to share, and hopes to live into. In and through all these places and things, we are one church, together.

I start with this affirmation because we are currently facing enormous, even historic, challenges, including a once-in-a-century pandemic and the greatest social unrest and call for reform than we have experienced in fifty years. (Ephesians 4:4-6).

Fortunately, our congregation has a long tradition of being a servant congregation, and we can draw on that tradition and our historic strengths to fulfill this important role we are called to at this time. But it will take all of us. Remember, WE are the Church. And while we may at times disagree on particular actions as we respond to these two monumental challenges before us, I hope and pray that we can agree that God invites us to work to establish a world where all of God's children are accorded dignity, safety, and respect.

"Who is the Church?" "We are the Church!"

Because of that truth, I remain confident that we will get through these crises together and, by God's grace, come out on the other side stronger.

### MEMO to FUMC Members regarding June 28, 2020 Drive-In Worship

Our Team met again on Monday, June 15 to assess, evaluate, discuss, and make decisions regarding the immediate and future worship schedule of our church in the midst of ongoing COVID-19 concerns.

We are excited to welcome everyone to First United Methodist Church's first Drive-In worship on June 28, 2020 at 9:00am.

We are planning specific measures to assure the safety of all worshippers. Among these measures are physical distancing and wearing of masks. We will have our music worship team and Pastor Dale's sermon delivered from the pavilion. Worshippers can tune into 106.7 FM to listen to the service.

We have established expectations to facilitate a safe Drive-In/Outdoor worship experience.

Members are expected to:

- Practice physical distancing while on the church property for the worship.
- Worshippers can stay in their vehicle or sit outside in lawn chairs, on blankets, or on benches.
   Worship leaders will set up on the church pavilion.
- Masks must be worn by anyone who is not in their vehicle (until seated). Seating location options include:

Benches close to the pavilion – limit to one family per bench (benches will be set up with physical distancing in mind) – benches should not be moved.

Worshippers can bring their own lawn chairs or blankets to sit on the lawn. If you are seated on the lawn, we ask that groups maintain 12 feet of distance between themselves and other family groups.

If you are outside your vehicle you will need to bring your own FM radio to tune into the worship service. Worshippers will tune into 106.7 FM to listen to the service.

Remaining within a vehicle provides the safest option for worshippers.

The church building will not be open, so worshippers should not expect to be given access to the restroom facilities. The playground will also be closed.

We request that members do not attend the Drive-In worship if experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 or

other flu-like symptoms.

If unable to attend or planning to stay at home, feel free to attend the worship via Facebook Live on our church Facebook page (<a href="www.facebook.com/">www.facebook.com/</a> lindstrommethodist)

Use South Parking lot entrance when arriving and follow parking instructions. Attendants will direct parking.

Volunteers will greet and hand out Orders of Worship when entering. Financial offerings will also be received upon entering and exiting the parking lot. All volunteers will be wearing masks and gloves.

Additionally, we are not planning for a specific date to return to full indoor worship. Additional Drive-In worship opportunities may be held throughout the Summer depending on feedback received from our first one on June 28.

We will continue to adhere to the recommendations from the CDC and the Minnesota Department of Health. We recognize that ongoing separation of our faith community is frustrating for some. We all long to be back together. We will continue to look for ways that we can gather virtually or connect in other safe ways. Your suggestions are welcome. Please contact the church office or a member of the CARE Team.

#### June Church Financial Update

Financially, First United Methodist Church is feeling the effects of COVID-19 as well. During the months of March & April giving was below normal but at a manageable level, in May giving dropped a little further. January thru May totals for 2020 are \$56,707 compared with \$73,816 (2019) and \$77,394 (2018).

One of the blessings in the past couple months is that church leaders who normally receive honorarium payments have elected not to accept any dollars during this period, God bless each of you. Church expenses have been a little lower as well without people using the building but the difference between income and expenses has been razor thin.

In June with one week remaining the giving has been significantly lower so hopefully we have a good turnout on the last Sunday of the month and first outdoor service.

#### Rev. John C. Blackford Scholarships

In 1959 the Rev. John C. Blackford was transferred by the United Methodist Church Annual Conference to Lindstrom, MN, and served at First UMC for 25 years. In 1959, the Lindstrom church was a small white church on Highway 8 with the parsonage next door and also was a former Swedish Conference Methodist Church. Again, God blessed John's ministry, and the church outgrew its building on Hwy 8, and the wonderful and farsighted congregation embarked on a building plan. The new (current) Lindstrom Church was completed in 1968, and since that time this fine facility has been a blessing from God to the members of First UMC and the community it serves. In honor of Pastor Blackford's commitment to ministering in the Lindstrom area and beyond for so many years, the First UMC Foundation Board has scholarship opportunities in his name and memory, for students who are members, or related to members of First UMC.

#### **Church Council Minutes**

June 16, 2020

The June meeting was conducted via Zoom; opened with a prayer led by Pastor Dale.

## Covid-19 Response per newly formed C.A.R.E. Advisory Team:

The C.A.R.E. team met on June 15th to discuss the logistics for the drive-in/outdoor service (to be held June 28) and for the two scheduled funerals – Babe **Anderson** (6/27) and **Duane Jones** (7/18). Drive-In Worship: An email is being sent with the details; a graphic was created for Facebook. The recommendations at the time of these minutes are that people adhere to physical distancing (cars parked every other spot, no more than 1 family per bench, maintain 12' distance when outside of vehicle). There will be no speaker set up (due to lag between what you'd hear on radio vs. in a vehicle on the radio). The radio station (106.7) has been tested (thank you Brett, Duane and Gerry!). If sitting outside vehicle, please bring own radio (or radio app on phone). Few notes: bathrooms will not be open; playground closed during service. Service will still be available virtually. Funeral services: Immediate family only, every other pew, masks recommended. No singing or A/C, no Bibles or Hymnals. We are keeping with many other area Churches; and safety is a top priority.

Clarification on who can come back to services once re-opened: ALL are welcome back to Church! It is at the discretion of the individual if they choose to come to the outdoor service (or at a later date, indoor services). We are looking forward to seeing everyone.

Missions: July mission is Brush with Kindness. Also talked about doing a Compassion Drive for the Twin Cities, as several items are in short supply (especially volunteers, diapers, bottled water, laundry detergent, feminine products). A schedule for item drop offs will be sent out.

**SPRC Update:** A timeline for **Carol's** replacement hire has been agreed upon, plan is to have new hire by August 1. Position is on website, Chicago County Press, Community Facebook page and Church Facebook page. July 12 is the application cutoff. Retirement party is still TBD; **Carol's** last day is still scheduled for July 31. Worship Team Leader: No need to

fill immediately, can be done through combination of **Pastor Dale** and volunteers. Details TBD once inperson services resume.

**Foundation Committee:** Taking scholarship applications for the Rev. John C. Blackford Scholarship Fund through July 10th; will be announced end of July.

**Other items:** Andy thanked Pastor Dale for his help editing the Memorial Day service. Service was well received; Andy has been receiving messages and replies from all over the U.S.

Meeting was adjourned with a prayer led by **Pastor Dale.**




