Feed My Starving Children Mission Focus for August

A Christian non-profit founded in 1987, Feed My Starving Children tackles world hunger by sending volunteer-packed, nutritious meals to 70 countries, where they're used to operate orphanages, schools, clinics and feeding programs to break the cycle of poverty.

Last year, FMSC welcomed nearly 1.2 million volunteers to pack more than 333 million meals to feed more than 913,555 kids daily for a year. The Minnesotabased charity spends more than 90% of total annual donations directly on feeding kids.

From the pastor...

Dear Friends,

God will cover you with his wings, and under those wings you will find refuge. –Psalm 91:4

We're now in what's often called "the dog days of summer."

While we associate that term with the unrelenting heat and humidity of late July and August, the ancient world associated it with draught, plague, and ill fortune. Given the kind of summer we're having — with pandemic, economic woes, and social injustice and unrest — that ancient description suddenly doesn't seem exaggerated at all!

Perhaps it's for this very reason that so many of us head north for a respite. If you are able to do that, blessings for a time away that leaves you refreshed and renewed. Others have recognized that doing something – almost anything – to address the challenges of the day can also be restorative in that it reminds us we are not victims but servants who are ready and willing to help and make a difference wherever there's a need.

In addition to retreating and working, a third means by which we may not simply weather these dog days but flourish amid them is to be immersed in God's promises. Psalm 91, the inspiration for a variety of Christian hymns and imagery, was addressed to Israelites feeling oppressed by circumstances and opponents and therefore greatly in need of a word of encouragement. In this beloved Psalm, God promises presence, protection, refuge and renewal. As you read the words below, imagine them addressed personally to you so that you, in turn, can reach out in love to someone else in need of encouragement.

You who abide in the shadow of the Almighty will say to the Lord, "You are my refuge and my fortress, my God in whom I trust." God will deliver you from the snare of the hunter and from deadly pestilence. God will cover you with his wings and under those wings you will find refuge. God's faithfulness will be your shield, so that you will not fear the terror of the night or the arrow that flies by day, or the pestilence that stalks in darkness, or the destruction that wastes at noonday (Psalm 91:3-6).

Blessings to you for renewed energy, commitment, and hope during these summer days!

August Update from the C.A.R.E. Team!

Our team met on July 20 and decided to hold Drive-In/Outdoor worship services each Sunday in August at 9:00 a.m. Our recommended safety measures remain the same as were in place at our June 28 and July 26 outdoor/drive-in services.

They are as follows:

- *Practice physical distancing while on the church property for the worship.
- * Worshippers can stay in their vehicle or sit outside in lawn chairs, on blankets, or on benches. Worship leaders will set up on the church pavilion.
- * Masks must be worn by anyone who is not in their vehicle (until seated). Seating location options include: Benches close to the pavilion limit to one family per bench (benches will be set up with physical distancing in mind) benches should not be moved.
- * Worshippers can bring their own lawn chairs or blankets to sit on the lawn. If you are seated on the lawn, we ask that groups maintain 12 feet of distance between themselves and other family groups. If you are outside your vehicle you will need to bring your own FM radio to tune into the worship service. Worshippers will tune into 106.7 FM to listen to the service.
- * Remaining within a vehicle provides the safest option for worshippers.
- * The church building will not be open, so worshippers should not expect to be given access to the restroom facilities.
- * The playground will also be closed.

We request that members do not attend the Drive-In worship if experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 or other flu-like symptoms.

Church Council Minutes

July 21, 2020

Council Members Present: Pastor Dale, Mark Vanderwerf (standing in for Wendy), Donn Arnold, Juanita Morgan, Erin Thorvaldson, Emily Honerbrink, Scott Lecy, Tom Ervasti, Andy Wilkerson

The July meeting was conducted via Zoom; opened with a prayer led by Pastor Dale.

SPRC – Juanita, Donn, and Pr. Dale: We are interviewing candidates (2) on Wednesday, July 22. A list of questions was sent/approved by SPRC. No deadline for hire, but would like Carol to be able to train; hopeful start date is Tuesday, July 28. Sunday, July 26 - outdoor Church service, Carol will be guest of honor. Will have table set up, close to pavilion, basket for cards, set up for Carol to greet people without being closer than 6'. Will be able to write messages to her. County Press interviewed Carol, article will be published this week. Craig Stockel will say a few remarks.

Outdoor service July 26: John C. Blackford scholar-ships being awarded

C.A.R.E. Team - Rebecca, Mark, Barb, Terry, and Pr. Dale: Took into account suggestions/concerns. Concerns include Church isn't doing enough to provide spiritual connection. Virtual worship isn't doing it. Decided to solicit feedback via email, Terry Kopp to make an announcement Sunday. Ideas include virtual Bible studies, limited number of people in church for Bible studies, etc. Need to know hopes and desires of the congregation. Outdoor drive in worship every Sunday in August. Bret RempleEwert working with others to provide unique experiences (for instance, this weekend is bluegrass) for each weekend. Talked a lot about data from MN Department of Health; closely following their recommendations. Being very respectful of information available; also aware that adults are capable of making own decisions.

Finance - Scott: June finances are a mirror image of May. Lower giving totals as expected, offset by lower expenses. Just paying overhead/salaries, covering bare essentials. \$5300 down from start of year is a minor concern, not significant yet. Totals in June, 3 weeks in, \$5600 in giving. Announced at worship service and in newsletter, people stepped up and doubled (\$5550 given that Sunday). \$5900 so far in July; hoping for one more good weekend. \$67,800 contributed so far this year; \$91,300 at this

point in 2019. Savings account has had very little movement.

Trustees – Mark: Finishing up kitchen project; some cleaning issues after the installers finished. New crew coming out to do finishing touches.

Foundation – Donn: Committee got together to evaluate Rev. John C. Blackford scholarship applicants. Two wonderful scholarship recipients, each receiving \$1500. Funds handed out on Sunday, July 26; both will be in attendance.

Missions: Scott delivered collected donations for Minneapolis; donations were very appreciated and the receiving Church would like to extend a 'thank you' to our Church. Number of packages of diapers, laundry, soap, paper products. Filled up a cartful of donations.

Publicity/Social Media – Erin, Pr. Dale: Erin, Pr. Dale and Barb continue to post. Posts have included the inspirational memes, live premieres of the worship service, images of drive in service, recent job posting. Live premieres haven't been very successful; people like to watch on their own time. Need to continue facebook live stream the outdoor worship service; Erin will help with that the 26th. Andy suggested advertising drive up Sunday services using Living Nativity sign on highway ("Outdoor/drive in worship Sunday's in August, 9am. Social Distance approved."). Will work to get it out prior to August 2nd. Andy to work on sign, Erin to contact middle school principal.

Meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.




