August Mission Focus: Family Pathways - School Supply Drive

Family Pathways works alongside people to enhance lives through a continuum of essential services and - together with the community - champions positive change.

Across East Central Minnesota, over 8% of our neighbors do not have the ability to consistently provide healthy food for their families. Many of them report going hungry or skipping meals to ensure food goes to their children. The Family Pathways Food Pantry provides access to healthy food for families and individuals.

With the support of the community, Family Pathways actively works to correct disparities so all people can have what they need to achieve and maintain health, well-being and prosperity. A small donation can make a BIG difference - just \$10 feeds a family of four for a week!

During the month of August, our mission contributions will assist the distribution of nutritious foods to local individuals and families. As always, food and toiletry donations are welcome in the collection cart in the foyer!

The month of August also signals the time for students to prepare to go back to school. For many families in our community, purchasing the supplies needed for school is a financial strain or impossibility. You can help by donating supplies commonly needed by students in our community. These items will be distributed to those who need them most through the Family Pathways Food Pantry and potentially the Safe Haven Foster Shoppe.

Church Council Minutes

July 13, 2021

The July meeting was opened with a devotional from Terry Kopp.

Consent Agenda Discussion: Council discussed use of Consent Agendas (following Roberts Rule of Order). *Motion Passed*. All committees will submit their reports to the Council Secretary (Emily) by the Thursday before a Council meeting for consolidation.

Old business: Two open spots on Council. Boni Stockel willing to serve. *Motion Passed*. One spot remains if you feel called to serve.

Finance Report: Church in need of a computer professional for offsite backup, ongoing maintenance, IT/help desk needs and software updates. Lloyd volunteered to research options.

Key ministries: Ongoing discussion until strategic planning takes place. Council members were asked to bring ideas for key ministries to the table, suggestions include: Children, Youth, Adult, Missions, Outreach, Disciple-making, Training, College/Post High School-age, back to fun, ministry through music/variety of music, reaching an older crowd, Biblebased.

Organizational committee structure: Council reviewed structure of United Methodists, including how our Church fits into our District, the Annual Conference and the General Conference. Reviewed organization structure of FUMC. Discussed having potential Co-Chair of Council for ease of transition; saved for future discussion.

Mission statement: Council reviewed past mission statements and voted to use one statement moving forward. Motion passed. Our Mission Statement is "As followers of Jesus Christ, we will proclaim the message of God's kingdom and bring hope to a hurting world beginning in Chisago County"

SPRC Children's Ministry Proposal: Peter Leadholm, SPRC Chair, brought forward a proposal for a Children/Youth Ministry paid position. He read a letter prepared by the SPRC, which emphasized the importance of our youth and the importance they play in the health and longevity of the Church. Motion Approved to continue exploration, including breaking down the hours by tasks and creating a job description. Council made affirmation that they stand behind this position and the SPRC. Finance committee to further discussion how position could be funded, Foundation also to discuss.

Meeting closed with Prayer. Next meeting August 17th, committee reports due by August 12th.

The following reports were submitted to the Council Secretary prior to the meeting:

Missions:

MN adult and teen challenge visited on Father's Day Sunday, shared testimonies and led worship. No giving total yet.

July we will be introducing a new mission: Safe Haven Foster Shoppe. They are a local nonprofit that offers bags of age, gender and size specific essentials to MN foster care families.

Memorial Meeting- May 22nd, 2021:

Present: Pastor Kneen, Lloyd Jones, Linda Ploog, Shirley Oswald, Sharlene Arnold

Discussed: Methods of organizing funds coming into memorials and how to disperse them. Letters are being sent out to various committee chairs asking for priority lists of their needs and wants. Submit the list of items, with prices included, by September 1st. Once received, the lists will be reviewed and decisions will be made. Two additional people were added to the committee list; Judy Green and Cheryl Hultquist-Auchterlonie.

SPRC:

Reviewed role of SPRC, confidentiality and introduction of new members: The job description of the SPRC comes from the Methodist "Book of Discipline". Pastor Chris passed out a copy for the committee to review. The process we will follow for solving problems comes through the bible in Matthew 18.

Book Club: The committee is currently reading the book, "Antagonists in the Church". There was discussion about the book to bring the new members up to speed and to recap what has been read.

Dear Friends in Christ,

One of the important responsibilities of ministry in a community church like ours is pastoral care. To provide adequate care to those who cannot attend in-person worship any longer and those dealing with a crisis (i.e. health, relationship, financial, etc.) our church cannot rely upon the pastor alone; the pastor needs lay members who have been trained to assist in such ministry so our congregation can maintain consistent contact with those in need. I am looking for volunteers in our congregation who have the gift of empathy, who can maintain confidentiality and who want to learn how to provide this type of care to others. FUMC will provide the training needed. The time requirement will be an in-person monthly meeting with the Pastor at FUMC. The meeting will be approximately two hours. The first few months will consist of training. After adequate training each member of the Pastoral Care Team will be assigned a person or persons to contact weekly either face-to-face or by phone. I hope you will prayerfully consider this important calling to ministry. If you do not feel called but think you know someone in the congregation who would be good at this ministry please submit his or her name to the church office.
