Zoe Empowers

Equipping vulnerable children with tools and training to overcome life threatening poverty for good.

380 million children are trapped in the cycle of poverty. Orphaned and vulnerable children living in extreme poverty are abused, sick and isolated from their community. Through Zoe Empowers, children who once lived in poverty become entrepreneurs, providers, and leaders in their community who know their worth and abilities.

Council Reports

Committee Reports submitted by committee chairs, compiled by Council Secretary, Emily Honerbrink.

Missions: In August the congregation gave \$750 and a box of school supplies to support Family Pathways. Thank you for your generosity! The mission focus for September is NOMADS. This organization utilizes volunteers to improve people's living conditions while spreading the love of Christ. A focus on NOMADS was shared during service on September 19.

The next mission focus during service will be October 10. Additional information about missions is always available on the website, in the newsletter, and in the bulletin.

Memorial: The Memorial Committee reviewed the "wish lists" submitted by seven committees, narrowing down their choices and setting a timeline for purchasing the designated items. Some action will take place this fall, but most will be bumped into 2022. The committee's next meeting will be on October 4th at 10:30a.m. The group will be deciding on the date(s) for fund spending.

SPRC

- There will be a sign put up at the Nursery about keeping it cleaned up and organized (just waiting on the printer to be repaired)
- Pastoral Care team training will begin on October 6th (One more member is still needed)
- There will be a Sunday school skit/mentorship for students in the craft time starting on Sept. 12th the SPRC members will participate for the first week then confirmation kids will take over helping Chris during Sunday school.
- Youth Ministry Updates
- Job Description for the position
- PR & Active recruiting someone for the role
- Strong Communication plan
- Sunday school will be PK-5th (or could be 6th)
- New timeframe will be 2-3 month
- Matthew 18 training will be moved to the next meeting
- We reviewed and discussed the SPRC Feedback/Review Worksheet that many members completed (looking for common themes and compiling responses)
- This will be submitted to the Superintendent in October. It will be a virtual meeting.
- More discussion about Youth Ministry
- Curriculum needs to be "age appropriate"
- How do we care for whoever comes to Sunday school? Some children may not come with a parent?

Finance:

Statement of Activities – Offerings (giving) for July: Lloyd reported the last four months offerings have been below monthly budget. August is a five Sunday month which should help monthly totals. July has a -\$4847 deficit. YTD numbers remain positive at \$16,496. This compares to a

YTD deficit of \$8007 in 2020.

Dedicated Accounts – The Finance Committee has been working to eliminate zero (\emptyset) balance accounts and combining other accounts.

Discussion regarding 904 – Youth Camp/Mission. Reimbursements are "slow". Lloyd will make an announcement this Sunday to remind parents to submit a reimbursement form.

Continuing discussion regarding Youth/Children's ministries allocation and funding. The foundation has offered to help fund the onboarding of this staff position pending long term funding and budget. The SPRC has created a job description with the framework for a 24 hour position.

The Memorials leadership team reached out to all committees regarding their "wish list" and priorities. Memorials currently has \$21,279 in their account. Memorial funds dedicated to specific functions will continue to be kept on a separate ledger (ie. Youth, missions, etc). General donations are available to be used as the committee determines.

New Business – open discussion -establish key roles/responsibilities/priorities for the Finance Committee moving forward.

Key target areas:

- 1. Financial Chart: Create 3 year history chart to compare monthly giving/expenses. (Verna/Lloyd)
- 2. Online/alternative giving: Work on communication to expand giving for folks not able to attend in-person worship. Tithe.ly; direct bank automatic pay, etc. Current online giving is around \$100/month. (Verna)
- 3. Special Gifts: Update 1996 policy regarding special gifts. The current policy distributes special gifts 1/3 to memorials; 1/3 foundation and 1/3 trustees.

Suggestion is to move special gift accounts to Memorials as they are typically onetime gifts. (present to August Council meeting)

- 4. Doris Brand trust: Update numbers for Doris Brand trust. The last statement I have is April 2021 with a balance of \$25,536. Work with council to move to Memorials Committee.
- 5. Dedicated accounts: Continue to focus on cleaning up the accounts. Current recommendation is to eliminate 920 (Puzzles, Pie & Potato Soup); 916 (Hootenanny); 917 (Thursday Night Family); 928 (Pavilion) as individual accounts.
- 6. Budget: September timeframe to create and submit 2022 budget.
- 7. Stewardship Drive: Fall timeframe
