They also offer emergency shelter and 3 meals a day to hungry neighbors. They do not rely on government funding; almost all of their funding comes through donations from individuals and businesses. While other homeless shelters provide meals and a place to stay for people from the community, Union Gospel Mission Twin Cities goes further to provide a permanent pathway off the streets.

The December meeting was opened with a devotional from Adrienne Stegmeir based on 'God's most successful setback'

The following reports were submitted to the Council Secretary prior to the meeting:

#### SPRC:

In attendance: Peter, Emily, Tina, Pastor Chris, Andy, Tami and Dorothy.

Andy's devotions focused on the 80th Anniversary of Pearl Harbor. This went right into Highs and Lows. We were reminded of another year, 1968, that people at that time felt it couldn't get any worse. There were events that happened in space that spoke of our belief that there is a God. Lovell received a telegram in 1969 that said "you saved 1968". God never gives up on us, we can't give up either. Or as one of our younger family members said "Don't count the days, make the days count".

Trustee budget: Our 2022 budget has been reduce to \$1500.00, Lloyd will keep an eye on it for next year.

Intern for Trustees: Ad Council has requested that each committee have someone know how to run that committee if so needed.

Handbooks: Each committee is to create a handbook on what are the duties of the chairperson of each committee.

#### **Review Statements**

Statement of Financial Position — Suggestion to add values for main church property and assets for future.

Statement of Activities — Offerings (giving) for October \$15,442 which is \$3,815 above the four year average 2018-2021: the projected FY2021 revenue is tracking above budget.

Dedicated Accounts — All approved changes completed to consolidate small, intermittent activity-based accounts. Doris Brand account remains an open item. Current signer is Scott Lecy. Action: Verna will follow up with Scott to update.

#### **New Business**

The auditor recommended a Financial Control Policy be created. A final copy was distributed and approved for release.

Grant for Children's Ministry Program submitted for \$20,000. Awards will be announced the end of November. Keeping our fingers crossed!

#### **Key target areas:**

Financial Chart: 3 year history chart to compare monthly giving/expenses. Completed and distributed. This will be a living document distributed to the finance committee monthly (Verna/Lloyd)

Doris Brand trust: Update numbers for Doris Brand trust. The last statement we have physically is April 2021 with a balance of \$25,536. Edward Jones office confirmed signer is Scott Lecy and couldn't give info until signer is updated. Open item.
