The Voice of the Martyrs (VOM) is a nonprofit, interdenominational missions organization that has been serving persecuted Christians around the world since 1967. The organization is dedicated to inspiring believers to deepen their commitment to Christ and to fulfill His Great Commission — no matter the cost.

Voice of the Martyrs five purposes:

1. To encourage and empower Christians to fulfill the Great Commission in areas of the world where they are persecuted for their involvement in propagating the gospel of Jesus Christ. This is accomplished by providing Bibles, literature, radio broadcasts, medical assistance, and other forms of aid.

2. To give relief to the families of Christian martyrs in these areas of the world.

3. To equip local Christians to love and win to Christ their enemies who are opposed to the gospel in countries where believers are actively persecuted for their Christian witness.

4. To undertake projects of encouragement, helping believers rebuild their lives and Christian witness in countries that have formerly suffered Communist oppression.

5. To emphasize the fellowship of all believers by informing the world of atrocities committed against Christians and by remembering their courage and faith.

October 18, 2022

The October meeting was opened with a devotional from Emily Honerbrink based on 2 Corinthians 9:7

Annual Scheduled Committee Report Cheryl Lecy provided the committee report. Has met three times; determined outreach events. See committee report in newsletter. Cheryl will present to congregation 10/23.

Old business:

- Outreach chair: Cheryl Lecy has agreed to be Chair
- Charge Conference Date: No date set yet; waiting on Conference reply
- Request to change name of Worship committee to Sunday Morning Experience (SME) to help alleviate confusion between groups - change passed
- Soft budget review: Major increases in heating and insurance; really need everyone to come together. Can't keep spending if we don't have money coming in, but recognize that some increases are ungvoidable. Everyone is nervous about inflation; want to recognize and say a huge "thank you" to all who are contributing financially to keep the Church running. Lots of excitement building for programs that change lives, feel like there is forward momentum. Discussion on sending "thank you" cards to new givers.
- Open positions on ministry team spreadsheet: Still looking for Chairs for Children and Adult ministries. Twenty some names thrown out for various open positions, council members assigned to call and discuss positions with each individual. NOTE: If you feel called to serve, please talk to Pastor Chris about the various opportunities - very personally rewarding!

New business:

- Denomination Future Local Strategy
- Talked about the communications planning for the future potential amicable separation of the United Methodist Church. Lots of information floating around and want to be sure that our members are getting their information from reliable sources.
- The SPRC is tasked with creating a communications plan around the decision.
- Ad counsel will look to have time at the upcoming charge conference to talk to our conference representative. • Note: As of now, no vote is required until 2024; we have until 2026 (at present, could change) to make a decision. However, we know that members are curious to know what is going on and we want to be as open as possible with what we know when we know it. Watch for future communications on the subject.
- If you have immediate concerns, please talk to Pastor Chris or a member of the SPRC. No decisions will be made until the vote takes place, but in the meantime we want to make sure your concerns are heard in a respectful manner; clear communication based on fact is important to ensure we maintain a healthy relationship with one another.
